Curriculum in Year 2

RE

Old Testament Stories

The children will be learning about the importance of God's people through the Old Testament stories. Year 2 will begin to develop a wider understanding and deeper knowledge of God. The children will learn about Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jonah, and David.

The children will learn more about the life of Mary and the disciples of Jesus.

During Advent, they will learn about preparing for the birth of Jesus and The Advent wreath.

Maths

The children will be developing their knowledge of number and place value this term. The children will be learning how to recognise the value of a digit in a 2 digit number (28 = 20 and 8, 2 tens and 8 ones). We will be using the White Rose model to help encourage children to understand, embed and apply their mathematical knowledge. Throughout the year, we will also be learning the 2,3,5 & 10 tables.

Plants and Materials

The children will be learning about the importance of seeds and bulbs and which conditions are needed for seeds to grow and plants.

The children will be revisiting materials, their properties and uses and investigating which materials would be best in different scenarios.

Multiskills

Children will develop their games and multiskills using small and large balls. Working with a partner and in small groups, following rules and developing fair play rules.

Tag Rugby

The children will be introduced to Tag Rugby through fun, non-contact games. They will learn how to run with the ball, pass to teammates and tag opponents safely

Geography

The children will develop their locational knowledge and be able to locate and name the continents and oceans of the world. We will also be answering the question how do we get around our surrounding area? They will also be learning the names and location of the continents and oceans.



History (After half-term)

The children will become historians and investigate, learn and discover what happened in London in 1666. They will learn about the Great Fire and the importance of Samuel Pepys and his diary. They will use primary and secondary sources to learn more, asking questions and developing their historical vocabulary.

The children will be working with a range of materials to make marks and pictures.





Music

We will also be working with the Music Service and learning about rhythm and dynamics.

We will continue to have our weekly music lesson developing our drumming skills.

The children will learn how to be SAFE on the Internet. Developing a greater awareness of risks and preventions, the children will become much safer and knowledgeable about harmful things and people they can find on the internet.

We will learn about algorithms and writing codes.



Online life and offline life is just life

For many of us, we see our online lives and offline lives as different, but children are growing up with technology and the internet and for them there isn't a difference; online life and offline life is just life.

Technology can move at an extraordinarily fast pace and it can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they're doing online, who they might be speaking to or discussing the potential risks and issues.

Esafety

Talking

Talking regularly with your child is the greatest tool to help keep them safe online. Talking regularly and making it part of daily conversation, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed. It also means when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you.

But it can also be easy to become overwhelmed with the different technology, the language that children use, the huge number of games and apps which are available and the potential risks.

Tips for your conversation

Reassure them

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Try not to treat it like an interview

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Ask who they're talking to



Remind them about strangers



Online safety: top tips

Going online is a huge part of most young people's lives so it's important to talk to them about online safety. Here's our tips to get you started.



Chat to them about what they like to do online

The best way to find out what your child is doing online is to talk to them and have regular conversations so that online safety is part of everyday discussion. Ask them open-ended questions like 'What's your favourite game or app to play on?'.

- Listen to what they have to say and show an interest.
 They could give you a demo of their favourite app or show you their favourite YouTube or TikTok account.
- They will probably be able to teach you things you don't know! This will also give you an opportunity to chat about any safety settings they might already have in place.
- Regular conversations with your child will encourage them to come to you if they ever need support or advice.

Talk about who they are in contact with online

There are lots of different ways that children can talk to people online – messaging apps, on social media, and less obvious ways such as chat on online games. Talk to your child about who they are talking to and what they are sharing with them.

- Use settings to help limit who can contact your child.
- Remind your child that they shouldn't share personal information with people they don't know online.
- Let your child know they can come to you or another trusted adult if any conversation makes them feel uncomfortable.


